## 6th National Collegiate Recovery Conference

NPRC did not get out last week's newsletter because we were attending the Association of Recovery in Higher Education's 6th National Collegiate Recovery Conference. The conference was a wonderful event with a lot of top names in the industry presenting workshops or keynote addresses. There were 325 people in attendance.

## Alcohol Related Issues worldwide

A new report by The Organization of Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) found that "Alcohol now accounts for a higher proportion of deaths worldwide than HIV, AIDS, violence and tuberculosis combined."

Some areas of the world have shown significant increases in alcohol consumption; specifically the report found alarming increases in Iceland, Israel, Norway, Fin-

land, Sweden and Poland. The report also showed increases in alcohol consumption in China, Brazil, India and Russia. The report found that the average alcohol consumption has fallen by 2.5 per cent between 1992 and 2012. Currently consumption is at 2.4 gallons per capita. The U.S. average is 2.27 gallons.

In France, between 2010 and 2013, hospital admissions due to the con-

sumption of alcohol, among young people increased by 30%. The OECD suggests that some European countries such as the Czech Republic or Germany serve as role models for reducing rates of heavy drinking. In those countries, public health policies have seemed to have a significant impact on reduction of heavy alcohol consumption.
